ADMISSION POLICY

PURPOSE: To ensure that all potential students who are admitted into any program offered by Medical Career College of Northern California meet the school's admission requirements.

To ensure that all potential students show proof of proper documentation required for admission.

Academic Requirements

A potential student interested in enrolling in a program must complete the Application for Enrollment form. The applicant must meet and interview with school administrators prior to enrolling to ensure that they meet the minimum requirements for continuing the enrollment process. To be considered eligible for enrollment, the following requirement must be met:

- All applicants must be 18 years of age (under 18 years of age must have parent or guardian's approval)
- A High School Diploma*; OR
- Have a recognized equivalent of a High School Diploma: (e.g. GED)*
- Pass the school's entrance exam the Wonderlic with a score of 20 or better
- School's spatial acuity evaluation
- Provide documentation of eligibility to work in the United States
- Demonstrate the ability to read and write in standard English**

The school does not discriminate against a student for reason such as race, gender, age, ethnicity, sexual preference or religion.

The school do not participate under the Ability to Benefit criteria.

Admission Testing

An applicant must achieve a minimum passing score of 20 on the school's entrance examination, the Wonderlic as well as the Spatial Acuity evaluation for admission both the Medical Assisting with Limited Permit X-ray Program as well as the Limited Permit

X-ray Program. The test will be administered and scored in accordance with the test providers recommendations. Every effort will be made to provide a quiet, comfortable environment for the student to take the test. A student who does not receive a passing score on the entrance test may return in 2 weeks for another test. If a passing score is not obtained on the second test, the student will not be allowed to enroll. The test results are recorded as either pass or fail.
